GREAT THANKSGIVING AND LITURGY OF REMEMBRANCE

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts and give thanks to God.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Blessed are you, O God who with your Word and Holy Spirit created all things and called them good.

We give thanks for the great cloud of witnesses, who you sent into our lives to teach, to lead, to guide, to counsel, to challenge, to bear witness, to parent, to love us with your love.

We give you thanks for all the saints, who from their labors rest.

We give you thanks for our beloved siblings who we have named and for all of your beloved children unnamed, but known and loved by you. We light a candle today for those who have died world-wide from COVID, cancer, and other diseases, and those who have died at the hands of violence and natural disasters. You, O God, were their rock and their light in the darkness. We feebly struggle, they in glory shine.

And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and sing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Holy are you, and blessed is Jesus Christ. By the baptism of his suffering, death and resurrection you gave birth to your church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Holy Spirit.

On the night before Jesus gave his life for us he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:

“Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said:

“Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.”

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ’s offering for us.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts, that in the breaking of the bread and the sharing of the cup we may know the presence of the living Christ and be renewed as the body of Christ for the world, redeemed by Christ’s blood.

Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, strengthen us to run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the Author and Perfector of our faith.

By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at the heavenly banquet table forever.

Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and forever. **Amen.**
